

Bring along::

- **Sleeping bag** - safe is safe, especially for an unplanned stay on arrival or departure (weather-related may be necessary), a sleeping bag is very pleasant. Guesthouses and small hotels are rarely heated..
- **slippers** - between the bedrooms and the living room you have to walk a short distance through the snow.
- **Flip Flops** - for the shower.
- **Ohropax** – - the cottage is very clairaudient, as we noticed.
- If needed a **thermos flask**.
- Whatever you want from the **Duty Free Shop...**

We have on site:

- **beds** including duvets and pillows
- **towels**
- Restricting **internet, electricity** and **mobile phone** reception (sockets according to European standard)



Luggage:

- WizzAir does not officially take **cartridges**. Last year there were no problems. When it is a problem, bring the cartridge back to the car and lend it with me (10, - € per week - limited number available, Mammut, Ortovox and ABS)
- The **sports baggage** is cheap, officially it should not contain clothing. Even so, there were no problems last year. For ski boots a separate bag is allowed.
- **Check-in** necessarily via the Internet. Everything costs much more at the airport.

To arrival:

- We pick you up at the airport Kutaisi. Please provide us with a **mobile phone number** before departure so that we can contact you in the event of a flight delay or detour.
- Please keep **warm clothes** and **snow-resistant shoes** at hand as we will change to snowcat on arrival. At night it can get a bit colder in the cabin.

Money:

- There are no open shops, bars or kiosks in Bakhmaro. So there is no way to spend (cash) money. Alcoholic drinks on the spot or any rental equipment can be paid in Euros.
